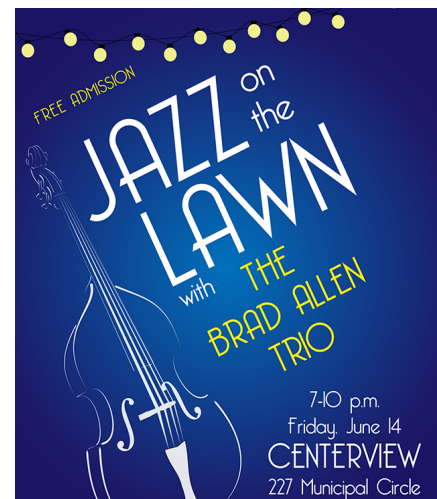

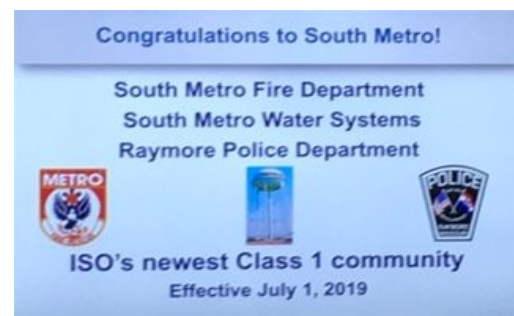
Upcoming
