Your new trash carts

We have purchased trash and recycling carts to assist residents and future vendors in providing high quality service. The carts come with a 15-year warranty and will eliminate the need for a Citywide trash cart swap in the event the residential waste vendor changes again in the future.

Each home has received one 96-gallon trash cart (black lid)* and one 65-gallon recycling cart (blue lid). You may start using these cans immediately.

The final trash/recycling/yard waste pickup days in Raymore with the current trash vendor will be Wednesday, July 10 and Thursday, July 11, with any additional pickup services through July 14.

Your trash day may change

As our community continues to grow, it is getting more difficult to provide service in only two days a week to more than 7,600 homes. When the trash pickup schedule is finalized, we will post signage in your neighborhood and send a post-card to each home with your new trash day. We will also post full details of trash service at www.raymore.com/trash as they become available.

In 2017 and 2018, the Chinese government implemented several waste import restrictions limiting or banning a variety of recyclable material that had previously been accepted for processing. This restriction created challenges for residents, solid waste departments, material recovery facilities (MRFs), processors, end users and more. We may see even further restrictions on items accepted for recycling in the near future.

Know what to toss in your recycling cart.

Make sure your recyclable items are clean, dry and empty (no food or liquid).

Never put recyclables in containers or bags.

Be thoughtful in your purchasing. Reducing waste is better than recycling.

Try to purchase items that can be used over and over again or recycled.

Choose metal or glass over plastic. Say no to plastic when possible.

Prevent contamination and rejected loads of recyclables by making sure only accepted materials go into the recycling cart. **When in doubt, throw it out.**
