### SOLID WASTE UPDATE

The City of Raymore is canceling its contract with Jim's Disposal, effective July 14. We will be transitioning to a new solid waste provider that day. The City has evaluated proposals from four solid waste companies and City Council will consider staff's recommendations at its meeting on Monday, June 17. [View the agenda for Monday's meeting.](#)

Carts are currently being delivered throughout town and cart deliveries will continue through the month of June.
