 Director Jim Cadoret met with the City of Parkville management team members to discuss the benefits of involvement in the Communities for All Ages initiative.

- Director Jim Cadoret and Associate Planner David Gress participated in the monthly meeting of the Cass County Non-Profits Coalition.
- The Planning and Zoning Commission will meet July 2 to consider the proposed <u>31st amendment</u> to the Unified Development Code regarding medical marijuana facilities. This ordinance is in response to the voter-approved Amendment 2 to the Missouri Constitution to allow for medical marijuana facilities to ensure patient access to medical marijuana. The Commission will also consider a conditional use permit request for fuel pumps as part of the proposed HyVee Fast & Fresh store.
- The request for rezoning and development plan approval for Conway Place, proposed for 5 acres located north of Pine Street, east of Sunset Lane, has been placed on hold. This request will not be considered by the Planning and Zoning Commission on July 2. Notification of a new public hearing date will be published when the applicant is ready to proceed.
