Proof of residency in a participating community is required. Drop off household hazardous waste at Eagle Glen Elementary School. **Acceptable items include:** automotive products, antifreeze, batteries, CFL light bulbs, fertilizers, flammables, fuels, hazardous cleaners and liquids, household cleaners, lawn and garden products, paint, pesticides, photographic chemicals, pool chemicals, solvents, thinners and used oil.
