- **COVID-19 City Statement:** The City of Raymore is working with local agencies and the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) to provide up-to-date reliable information on the novel (new) coronavirus, COVID-19, and its potential impact to our community. There are no known cases of the coronavirus in Cass County at this time. We are working with county and state public health officials to plan for needed responses and continue to assess whether we will need to cancel future public events or activities. - Annual Raymore Litter Cleanup, 8:30 a.m., Saturday, March 21 at Linear Park and Hawk Ridge Park. Pick up litter and remove invasive Japanese bush honeysuckle from the stream at Linear Park or pick up litter around Johnston Lake at Hawk Ridge Park. Both groups will meet at 8:30 a.m. for coffee, donuts and information. Cleanup starts at 9 a.m. and hot dogs will be served at 11:30 a.m. after a successful cleanup! - Census 2020. Check your mailbox in the coming days for a notice from the US Census Bureau to complete the 2020 Census online. This is the first year the census can be completed online, however residents may still complete the census by



phone or on paper through the mail. Every 10 years, the federal government conducts a population count of everyone in the United States by collecting basic information about the people living in each household. Data from the census determines the basis for distributing federal funding to communities across the country – including Raymore and Cass County – for vital programs such as Medicare and Medicaid, and public services, schools, hospitals, transportation and fire departments. The data also determines the number of congressional seats each state has in the U.S. House of Representatives. Strict federal law protects your census responses and the Census Bureau will never ask for Social Security numbers, bank or credit card account numbers, money or donations, or anything on behalf of a political party.
