# **COVID-19 City Update:**

- The City has established a COVID-19 resource webpage at raymore.com/covid-19. The webpage includes information on how to protect yourself and others from COVID-19, updates from Raymore and the Cass County Health Department, links to the Stay at Home order and FAQ, resources for assistance for individuals and business owners and a list of open businesses in Raymore.
- Trash routes have been running later than usual due to high amounts of waste material. Please be sure to properly bag your trash or use extra containers when possible to help limit worker contact with materials placed out for collection. To report a service miss or schedule a special bulk pickup or roll off container for spring cleaning, call Constable Sanitation's dedicated Raymore support line at 816-535-2020. - All park amenities have been closed. Green spaces and trails remain open.

#### **Parks & Recreation**

- Athletic Coordinator Todd Brennon met with South Metro Sports Group via Zoom preparing and planning for the delayed spring sports season.
- Recreation Coordinator Corinne Daut has been preparing for the upcoming Rocket League Tournament online and several other <u>online recreation</u> <u>opportunities</u>.
- Park maintenance staff worked on the Memorial Park playground replacement project, trimmed trees, mulched islands and began the mowing routine.
- Administrative staff continue to manage ongoing infrastructure projects including T.B. Hanna Station, Memorial Park and Recreation Park playgrounds.
- Parks staff placed closed signage at park playgrounds. Parking lots to the parks are closed, with the exception of the RAC and Hawk Ridge Park lots. Park amenities are closed, however trails and green space areas of all parks are open. Please continue to follow commendations for social distancing by the CDC.
