

COVID-19 City Update:

- The City has established a COVID-19 resource webpage at raymore.com/covid-19. The webpage includes information on how to protect yourself and others from COVID-19, updates from Raymore and the Cass County Health Department, links to the Stay at Home order and FAQ, resources for assistance for individuals and business owners and a list of open businesses in Raymore.

Upcoming

- The <u>City Council</u> Regular Meeting at 7 p.m., Monday, April 13, will be held virtually with council members conferencing into City Hall. In accordance with the State of Emergency declared by the Missouri Governor Executive Order #5 and the Cass County Health Department Order #20-06 requiring "shelter at home," the public will not be present. - **Census 2020.** Complete the census online, by phone or on paper through the mail. Data from the census determines the basis for distributing federal funding to communities across the country including Raymore and Cass County for vital programs such as Medicare and Medicaid, and public services, schools, hospitals, transportation and fire departments. Administration

• City Manager Jim Feuerborn, Assistant City Manager Mike Ekey, Police Chief Jan Zimmerman, Emergency Management Director Ryan Murdock and Communications Manager Melissa Harmer met daily to review updates from the State and County Health Department in response to COVID-19.

Development Services

- Staff continued work on preparing a report on the annual review of the Unified Development Code. The report will include several proposed amendments to the code.
- GIS Coordinator Heather Eisenbarth continued work on updating the various mapping applications utilized by the public and city employees. The mapping applications are being transferred to a new server.
- City Planner Katie Jardieu worked on updating graphics utilized in the City <u>Development Guide</u>, designed to assist residents, contractors and developers in understanding the development process in Raymore.
- Staff held several virtual meetings with developers regarding proposed development projects in the City.
- Building Official Jon Woerner continued final review of building construction plans for The Lofts at Fox Ridge apartment community. Installation of utilities to serve the development is nearing completion.
- Issuance of building permits for all construction activities in the City continues. Permits can be issued online and through the mail. Inspection of new homes, commercial building renovations, and exterior work done on properties (e.g. fences; pools; decks) continues. Only interior inspections (e.g. basement finishes; water heater installations) of occupied buildings have been temporarily suspended.


Parks & Recreation


- Parks maintenance staff began the weekly mowing routine. Additional spring clean-up items are underway throughout the parks.
- Recreation Coordinator Corinne Daut continues the virtual programming through the Parks and Recreation <u>Facebook</u> page.
- Athletic Coordinator Todd Brennon launched a series of <u>Parks & Rec Challenges</u> on our Facebook page. These simple, yet fun challenges help you stay active while our sports leagues are on hold.

• Parks & Recreation staff have been working together to maintain the public properties. Recreation staff as well as maintenance staff mulched the trees and landscape beds at City Hall, Centerview and the RAC.

Police

- The Police Department deployed the Communications/Command Vehicle and successfully tested remote dispatch capability.
- Chief Jan Zimmerman participated in the Metropolitan Chiefs and Sheriffs regional coordination conference call.
- Capt. Jim Wilson deployed the Communications/Command Vehicle to South Metro and was interviewed by Channel 4 regarding the "Taking It To The Streets" program and their partnership with first responders.
- All department members continued to participate in assigned on-line P.O.S.T. training.
- Efforts began to bring in-house testing for pet ailments to the Raymore
 Animal Shelter, saving the City
 approximately \$50-\$75 per animal. As a Registered Veterinary Technician,
 ACO Bailey Romi will be putting her certification to work by analyzing
 samples and then working with a local vetering.
