Upcoming

In accordance with Phase I of the State of Missouri's Show Me Strong Recovery Plan and the Economic Reopening Order from the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services, Raymore City Hall will be open to the public during regular business hours starting Monday, May 4, 2020.

Buildings & Codes staff and Utility, Court and City clerks will be behind glass windows, however there may be other people walking through the lobby at any time, so visitors at City Hall are encouraged to wear masks in the building, though it is not required.



Raymore City Council will hold its last work session meeting via Zoom at 7 p.m. on Monday, May 4, and then all City Council, board and commission meetings will resume on their regular schedules at Centerview. Centerview's Harrelson Hall offers enough space to allow the continued practice of social distancing requirements. Meetings will be open to the public, and any member of the public attending a meeting is required to adhere to social distancing guidelines.

Centerview event space will also open on Monday, May 4, with the same suggested, but not required, use of masks for visitors.

Some areas of Raymore parks will reopen starting Monday, May 4, including parking lots, restrooms, tennis courts, the skate park and baseball fields.

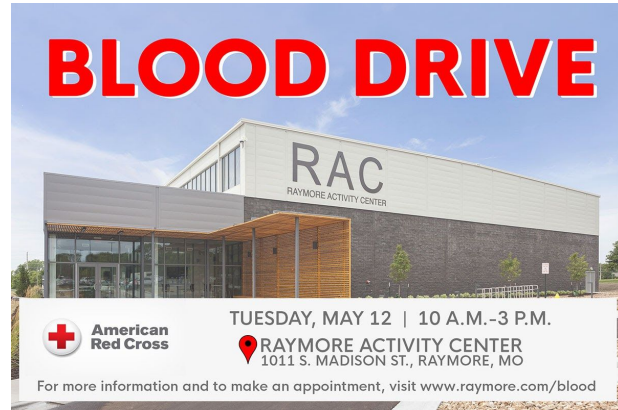
Residents are urged to continue to practice social distancing, good hygiene and frequent hand washing while utilizing our parks and refrain from gathering in large groups where social distancing cannot be observed.

Park restrooms will be cleaned and restocked daily, with a deep sanitation clean three times per week.

High traffic and high touch areas including playgrounds, basketball courts and the Raymore Activity Center will remain closed until May 31 under the guidelines of Phase I of the Show Me Strong Recovery Plan.

- The May 5 meeting of the Planning and Zoning Commission has been cancelled.
- The [Lofts at Fox Ridge](#) apartment community will start construction of the clubhouse and the first three apartment buildings in the next few weeks. Work will commence in the southeast corner of the site.
- Several development applications are currently under review for the Planning and Zoning Commission to consider at its June 2 meeting, including: [Rezoning](#) of five acres north of Foxwood Springs; annual review of the Growth Management Plan; vacation of the undeveloped alley that crosses through T.B. Hanna Station; the Eastbrooke at Creekmoor First Final Plat; and a replat of Brookside 10th Plat.
- Director Jim Cadoret participated in a webinar hosted by the International Council of Shopping Centers (ICSC) titled "Cannabis Tenants: Evaluating an Emerging Use".

- Parks & Recreation Director Nathan Musteen finalized the Parks & Recreation reopening plan.
