Re: MARC Planning Sustainable Places (PSP) Grant

City of Raymore staff have partnered with the City of Belton, MO and City of Grandview MO on the request for funds through MARC's Planning Sustainable Places (PSP) Grant program to support a transportation study along the I-49 corridor from Main Street in Grandview, MO, south to North Cass Parkway in Raymore and Belton.

The Planning Sustainable Places program continues the work of the Creating Sustainable Places initiative and the region's long-range plan, ConnectedKC 2050, promoting the concepts of:

- VIBRANT places that offer a mix of options for housing, jobs, services and recreation;
- CONNECTED places with a variety of transportation options; and
- GREEN places that support healthy living and a healthy natural environment.

PSP funds are intended to advance local planning efforts that support these principles.

The joint application would fund the Southland CONNECT Multimodal Plan, which proposes a feasibility study that will develop creative solutions for alternative transportation, including both active and motorized transportation options, within the study area to provide better connectivity with other job and activity centers around the region. These efforts will help support current and future community and economic development projects being led by each city within the study area.
