- Governor Mike Parson announced that Missouri will fully reopen and enter Phase 2 of the Show Me Strong Recovery Program on Tuesday, June 16, 2020. Although there is no statewide health order, the governor stressed it is still extremely important to continue to take extra precautions and practice social distancing to protect yourself and those around you.
- Playgrounds and basketball courts will open to the public by Tuesday, June 16 in accordance with Phase 2 of the Show Me Strong Recovery Program.

- Engineering
 - Work continues on the curb replacement program the contractor is currently working on Sunset Lane.
 - We have received several comments about the condition of the pavement at the Dean Avenue and Lucy Webb Roundabout. Repair of this area is included in the FY 2020 Street Preservation Project recently awarded by Council. In the short term, Operations staff fill potholes as necessary.
 - Work has started on Westgate Drive (Kentucky Road relocation). Please use caution in this area.
