- Obligation Bond Issues, Aug. 4.
 Raymore voters will have the opportunity to vote on two separate No Tax Increase G.O. Bond Issues at the polls on Aug. 4. If approved, these measures will bring more than \$23.5 million in improvements to Raymore's streets and parks without increasing the current property tax levy. Question 1 proposes more than \$17.5 million in improvements for streets, including a total reconstruction of Ward Road and Kurzweil Road, extensions of Johnston



Drive, Sunset Lane and 163rd Street, I-49 widening from 155th Street to North

Cass Parkway and street lights in two Raymore neighborhoods. Question 2 proposes \$5.9 million in improvements to the Raymore park system. Learn more about each proposed project and see a map of project locations at raymore.com/bondprojects.

The Planning and Zoning Commission will consider the rezoning and preliminary plan application on Aug. 4.
