Section 30.01 – Chain Of Command To Be Notified

The “Notification of the Chief in Significant Events” dictates situations which require Command notification. Members are reminded that notification is never considered improper, even in situations not on the Chief’s Memorandum.

Patrol Supervisors Notification

Communications will ensure that the on-duty sergeant is aware of situations requiring their presence for the purpose of assuming command. The sergeant will be informed of the instances listed above to allow appropriate notification of the chain of command.

Emergency Management Notification

*The Emergency Management Director will be notified in the following:

- A. Severe weather
- B. Natural disasters
- C. Man made disasters
- D. Hazardous material situations
- E. Major utility breaks or disruptions

In the event of a Tactical Team Call Out, Communications will ensure that the Operations Captain is notified.
