

Upcoming

No Tax Increase General Obligation Bond Issues, Aug. **4.** Raymore voters will have the opportunity to vote on two separate No Tax Increase G.O. Bond Issues at the polls on Aug. 4. If approved, these measures will bring more than \$23.5 million in improvements to Raymore's streets and parks without increasing the current property tax levy. Question 1 proposes more than \$17.5 million in improvements for streets, including a total reconstruction of Ward Road and Kurzweil Road,



extensions of Johnston Drive, Sunset Lane and 163rd Street, I-49 widening from 155th Street to North Cass Parkway and street lights in two Raymore neighborhoods. Question 2 proposes \$5.9 million in improvements to the Raymore park system, including an expansion of the Raymore Activity Center, an outdoor event space and trails at Centerview, added parking, trails and restroom at Hawk Ridge Park and more. - The Planning and Zoning Commission will meet Aug. 4, to consider the rezoning and preliminary plan for the expansion of Oak Ridge Farms subdivision, located at the eastern terminus of Pine Street, south of Cumberland Hills.
- Staff completed research and preparation of a proposed amendment to the Unified Development Code regarding the installation of small wireless facilities in the City. Small wireless facilities are typically attached to existing utility poles and allow wireless carries to offer 5G cellular service. The proposed amendment will be presented to the Planning and Zoning Commission for consideration in September.
