- The Planning and Zoning Commission will meet on Aug. 18 to consider a replat of Prairie View of The Good Ranch subdivision. The replat will increase the width of a gas line easement and will adjust lot lines for several affected lots.
- A Good Neighbor meeting will be held on Thursday, Aug. 20 at 6:30 p.m. at Centerview in Harrelson Hall on the proposed rezoning for the [Saddlebrook Subdivision](#). The rezoning request would allow for two-family dwellings to be constructed on the southern two-thirds of the development. The north one-third will be single-family dwellings. Review of this application had been placed on hold in 2018. The development was formerly referred to as Brookside South.
