 Candidate filing opens Dec. 15, 2020, for April 6, 2021 General Election.

The General Municipal election for the City of Raymore for the offices of City Council will be held April 6, 2021. Filing for this election opens at 8 a.m. on Tuesday, December 15, 2020 and continues through January 16, 2021. A \$20 filing fee is required at the time the candidate declares candidacy. One seat in each of the four (4) wards will be open to serve a two (2) year term. City Hall is open for filing 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, with the exception of the following holidays: December 24 and 25, 2020 and January 1 and 18, 2021.
