
Week of Dec. 7, 2020

at 8 a.m. on Tuesday, December 15, 2020 and continues through January 19, 2021. A \$20 filing fee is required at the time the candidate declares candidacy. One seat in each of the four (4) wards will be open to serve a two

(2) year term. City Hall is open for filing 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, with the exception of the following holidays: Dec. 24-25, Jan. 1, 2021 and Jan. 18, 2021.
