Upcoming

Record breaking freezing temperatures are sticking around for several more days. There are a few things you can do to prevent frozen pipes in your home:

- Make sure the cover of your water meter pit in your yard is closed securely.
- Open cabinet doors under your sinks to get warm air circulating around those pipes, especially if your sink is located on an exterior wall.
- Keep a small trickle of cold water running through the faucet at the highest point of your home. Allowing the faucet to be on prevents pressure from building up in the system, which is the cause of burst pipes. To run a small trickle for 24 hours costs less than 25 cents.
- Know where your main shut-off valve is located in case of an emergency. This can help you avoid a costly mess if a pipe should burst.
- Never use an open flame to thaw a frozen pipe. Use a hair dryer, light bulb or heat tape. When in doubt, call your plumber.
