On April 6, Raymore voters will be asked to consider a local use tax. If approved, the local use tax will fund new full time positions in Raymore's Police, Public Works and Parks departments. A use tax is NOT a tax increase or a double tax. Residents would simply pay a City use tax of 2.5 percent for goods purchased online the same way they pay a City sales tax of 2.5 percent on goods purchased at Raymore retail stores. The City relies heavily on local sales tax revenue to fund essential City services such as public safety and maintenance of streets, parks and public spaces. A local use tax will allow the City to continue to provide the exceptional services our residents expect by adding five new Police Officers, five new Public Works Maintenance Workers, three new Parks & Recreation Maintenance Workers and one new Recreation staff member to serve our growing community.

Raymore's population has grown by more than 34 percent since 2006, as have the corresponding increases in infrastructure, amenities and calls for service. However, the City has not created any new full time positions in Public Works or Parks since 2006, and has not created any new positions in Police since 2011.
