 The <u>City is hosting a Local Use Tax Informational Open House</u> from 6:30-8 p.m. on Wednesday, March 24, at Centerview, 227 Municipal Circle, for anyone interested in speaking directly with staff about the local use tax proposal.

On April 6, Raymore voters will have the opportunity to consider a local use tax, which, if approved, will fund new full time positions in Raymore's Police, Public Works and Parks departments.

A use tax is not a tax increase. If approved, residents will only pay a local use tax when purchasing goods from out-of-state vendors, such as Amazon. A local use tax will be applied at the same rate as Raymore's City sales tax, which is currently 2.5 percent.

Local sales tax revenues – which the City relies on heavily to fund essential City services – have been declining for years due to a rise in e-commerce. Approval of a local use tax will close that gap to allow the City to continue to provide the exceptional services our residents expect.

Since 2006, Raymore's population has grown by more than 34 percent, as have our community's amenities, infrastructure and calls for service. However, the City has not created new full time positions in Public Works or Parks in that time, and has not created new full time positions in Police since 2011.
