 single-family subdivision proposed for 146 acres located on the west side of
 Kurzweil Road, north of 58 Highway; and (2) the <u>Oak Ridge Farms Final Plat</u>, a
 58-lot single and two-family development proposed for 21 acres located along
 Pine Street, north of Ramblewood Subdivision.

Stonegate Subdivision. The applicant is requesting a rezoning to the R-1P zoning district to allow minor adjustments to the building setback requirements and requesting preliminary plat approval.
