The Preliminary Plat is contingent upon approval of the request to amend the development standards. The City Council will consider the request on July 12.

- Economic Development Director David Gress participated in the quarterly meeting of the Cass County Corporation for Economic Development.

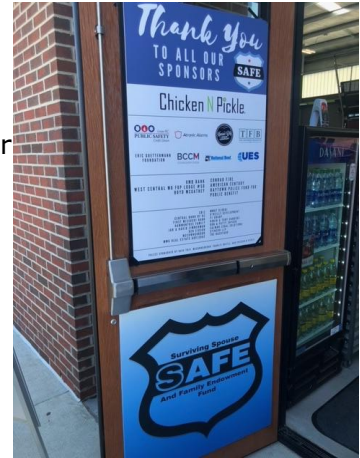
