

Development Services

- The Planning and Zoning Commission will meet July 20 at 7 p.m. to consider the rezoning and preliminary plat applications for the <u>Sendera</u> Subdivision, a 430-lot single-family subdivision proposed for 135 acres located on the south side of Hubach Hill Road, east of The Prairie of The Good Ranch.
- The Board of Adjustment will meet July 20 at 6 p.m. to consider a variance application to allow an on-site sewage disposal system on a 2.27 acre parcel located at the northeast corner of Hubach Hill Road and Char-Don Avenue.
- Economic Development Director David Gress participated in a local government and community development career expo hosted by Mid America Regional Council. The program is intended to engage and educate high-school students about different career paths within local government.
- Dan Sanders, representing MACO Development Company, LLC, filed a request to reclassify the zoning of 8 acres located on the south side of Lucy Webb Road, west of Dean Avenue, from "C-2" General Commercial District to "PUD" Planned Unit Development District to allow for the development of <u>Ridgeview Estates</u>, a 60-unit age-restricted garden-style residential community. A Good Neighbor meeting has been scheduled for Wednesday, July 28 at 6:30 p.m. at City Hall.
- Tony Ward filed a request to reclassify the zoning of the undeveloped west 46 acres of the Madison Valley Subdivision from "R-1" Single-Family Residential District to the "R-1.5" Single-Family Residential District to allow for Phase 2 of the Madison Valley Subdivision. A preliminary plat consisting of 154 single-family homes was also filed. A Good Neighbor meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, August 4 at 6:30 p.m. at City Hall.

• Pam Hatcher filed a request for a <u>variance</u> to the minimum lot width requirement to subdivide the property located at 1403 N. Madison Street into 3 lots. The Board of Adjustment will consider the request on August 17.
