Join our Raymore Police officers who are nationally certified Child Passenger Safety Technicians at the Raymore Festival in the Park for this free event and have peace of mind that your child is safely and properly secured in your vehicle. At checkup events, CPS Technician teams work with and teach caregivers the basics of correct selection, direction, location, installation and harnessing of car seats, booster seats and seat belts. These events provide opportunities to detect unsafe car seats and booster seats (such as recalls, damaged, missing parts/labels). - Economic Development Director David Gress participated in the monthly meeting of the MARC Solid Waste Management District Board.


#### **Parks & Recreation**
