

- Starting Monday, Oct. 4, City Hall's front entrance will be open and accessible via the ADA ramp while concrete replacement continues.
- Controlled blasting at Raymore Commerce Center. The contractor has scheduled the final controlled blast at the construction site for 10:30 a.m., Tuesday, Oct. 5. The controlled blast site is along I-49. The Missouri State Highway Patrol will slow northbound and southbound I-49 traffic for a few minutes
