Foxridge Dr. Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) includes items such as household cleaners, lawn and garden products, automotive fluids, paints and other chemical products. These flammable, toxic, corrosive or reactive items are labeled with danger, warning or caution. Accepted items include: automotive products, antifreeze, batteries, CFL light bulbs, fertilizers, flammables, fuels, hazardous cleaners, hazardous liquids, household cleaners, lawn and garden products, paint, pesticides, photographic chemicals, pool chemicals, solvents, thinners, used oil. The Commission approved the site plan for the <u>Hawk Ridge Park Wes</u>t improvements and tabled the consideration of the <u>34th amendment</u> to the Unified Development Code.

- Jake Loveless, representing Griffin Riley Property Group, LLC. filed a request to reclassify the zoning of 22 acres located at the northwest corner of Dean Avenue and Johnston Drive in the Timber Trails Subdivision from "R-3AP" Multiple-Family Residential Planned District to "PUD" Planned Unit Development to allow for a mixed use development including commercial and residential (apartment) uses.
