

Development Services

- The total number of dwelling units in the City has surpassed 9,000, with a total of 9,034.
- The Good Neighbor meeting for the <u>Timber Trails Mixed Use</u> development proposed for the northwest corner of Dean Avenue and Johnston Drive, originally scheduled for Wednesday, Nov. 10, has been cancelled. Consideration of the application by the Planning and Zoning Commission is on hold.
- A demolition permit was issued to remove the former Golden Corral building to allow for redevelopment of the property for a <u>Whataburger</u> restaurant.
- Allen & Mary Blanton filed a <u>variance application</u> to reduce the rear yard setback from 30 feet down to 21 feet to allow for a sunroom addition on

- their property at 513 Regina Ct. The Board of Adjustment will consider the request at 6 p.m. on Nov. 16.
- Steven Brown filed a request for a conditional use permit to establish an event center in the barn located at 16119 Kentucky Road. The Planning and Zoning Commission will consider the request on Dec. 7.
- City Planner Dylan Eppert participated in the Missouri Chapter of the American Planning Association annual conference.
