

- Communications Officers Dawson Farris, Jackie Lightle and Richard Hedrick celebrated their second, fourth and fifth anniversaries at Raymore PD.




- Communications Officer Madison Ritter attended training to become certified in the Missouri Uniform Law Enforcement System at MSHP Troop A in Lee's Summit.
