

REMINDER: Yard signs for April 5, 2022, election may be displayed beginning 30 days prior to the election (Sunday, March 6) and must be removed within five days after the election. One sign per establishment per street frontage is allowed for each event, issue, candidate or belief. Temporary signs located on street corners can be distracting to drivers and block sight lines at intersections. No signs are allowed in a designated sight triangle. - Development Services and Public Works staff met to review changes to the land use plan map and transportation plan map as part of the work on the City Comprehensive Plan.

Parks & Recreation

 Parks and Recreation Director Nathan Musteen, Superintendents Jimmy Gibbs and Steve Rulo and Athletic Coordinator Todd Brennon attended the Missouri Parks and Recreation Association's annual conference in Springfield, Missouri.

- Parks and Recreation Director Nathan Musteen participated in a three panel presentation on the award winning T.B. Hanna Station project highlighting the all-inclusive playground and sprayground and overall renovation of the park. Natalie Mackay of Unlimited Play and Todd Polk of CFS Engineers assisted Musteen in telling the story of T.B. Hanna Station.
