- Sean Seibert filed a request to reclassify the zoning of 8.72 acres located south of Pine Street, east of Madison Street, from "C-2" General Commercial District to "R-3A" Multiple-Family Residential District to allow for the 4th phase of <u>Oak Ridge</u> <u>Farms</u>. A Good Neighbor meeting will be held on March 23 at 6:30 p.m at Centerview.

- Brad Kempf, representing Summit Custom Homes, and property owner Hunt Midwest Real Estate filed a request to reclassify the zoning of 52 acres located on the west side of Dean Avenue, north of Lucy Webb Road, from "R-1P" Single-Family Planned Residential District to "PUD" Planned Unit Development District to allow for the <u>Allera</u> subdivision. A Good Neighbor meeting will be held on March 16 at 6:30 p.m. at City Hall.
- The Timber Trails 3rd phase has been resurrected and land clearing has commenced. The 3rd phase is located east of Dean Avenue and north of Shagbark Drive. A total of 42 single-family homes are proposed.

Police


- Communications Officer Dawson Farris and his wife, Emmy, welcomed their baby girl, Arlyn Rose. Mom and baby are happy and healthy!
