April 5 General Municipal Election Results: <u>Unofficial results from the Cass County Clerk/Election Authority</u> show Ward 1 City Councilman Reginald Townsend, Ward 3 City Councilman Jay D. Holman and Ward 4 City Councilwoman Sonja Abdelgawad re-elected to two-year terms on Raymore City Council.

Tabitha Forster, who ran against the incumbent Thomas R. Circo, was elected to serve as council member of Ward 2.

Kristofer P. Turnbow ran unopposed and will serve his third consecutive term as Raymore's mayor.

Ward 1 City Councilwoman Victoria Wills ran unopposed to fulfill an unexpired one-year term.

The mayor and council members will be sworn in at the City Council Regular Meeting at 7 p.m., Monday, April 11, at City Hall.

The Raymore City Council is the policy-making body of the City of Raymore. Its members are responsible for developing a budget for the City and adopting legislation that has the force of law within the City limits, within the bounds of Missouri statutes. <u>Learn more.</u>

- The Planning and Zoning Commission met on Tuesday, April 5th to review two
 rezoning requests, including the proposed 4th phase of Oak Ridge Farms, and the
 proposed Allera Subdivision. The Commission voted 8-0 to recommend approval of
 both applications to City Council
