- The Planning and Zoning Commission met on Tuesday, April 19th to review the Future Land Use Map as part of the Comprehensive Plan efforts. Department Director David Gress and City Planner Dylan Eppert presented information on proposed changes to the plan.

- An application was filed by VanTrust Real Estate requesting PUD rezoning and preliminary plan approval for the proposed <u>Raymore Commerce Center South</u> project, which includes the 262 acres of land located south of 195th Street, east of I-49, from its current "BP" Business Park Designation. The request would allow for the development of the site as a light-industrial business park. A Good Neighbor Meeting is scheduled for 6 p.m., Wednesday, April 27, at City Hall, 100 Municipal Circle.

#### Parks & Recreation

 The annual Raymore Easter Festival was Saturday, April 16. Traditionally held at Memorial Park, Parks and Recreation staff made the decision to move the event to



Recreation Park to accommodate larger crowds. The festival was held for the first time since 2019, due to concerns and restrictions surrounding COVID-19 in 2020 and 2021. An estimated 2,000 people attended the event and more than 15,000 eggs were collected within three minutes.
