- Development Services staff held a meeting with representatives from the Good Ranch to discuss ongoing development and marketing initiatives.

Parks & Recreation

- Athletic Coordinator Todd Brennon noted that this was the final week of the summer baseball and softball season. This week we held a total of 15 games at Recreation Park and 3 games at Memorial Park. End of season surveys have been finalized for parents and coaches and will be sent by the end of the week.
- New sod and grass seed was installed at Centerview as part of Phase II of the Centerview project.
- Perfect Game is hosting a 27-team baseball tournament at Recreation Park on Friday and Saturday this week.
- Men's Sunday night softball begins this Sunday at Recreation Park. We have a total of 9 (potentially 10) teams register for the summer season.
- Park Superintendent Steve Rulo and the park crews reset and cleaned up Recreation Park after the Spirit of America Event on July 1. The event brought an estimated 3,500 visitors to the park.
- Ballfield crews prepared fields for a 2-day, 27-team baseball tournament. Teams from the region will be using 3 fields for the event.

- Park crews began removing equipment and landscape materials at Hawk Ridge Park west in preparation for site improvements, parking and playground construction.
- Recreation Superintendent Jimmy Gibbs, Park Superintendent Steve Rulo and staff
 met with Recreation Coordinator Corinne Harkins to provide reviews and notes for
 the Spirit of America event. Staff also met to receive updates on community
 events through the end of the year.
- Centerview was the host site of the Kansas City Metro Parks and Recreation
 Directors Association meeting. 50 area parks and recreation administrators were
 welcomed by Recreation Superintendent Jimmy Gibbs who presented an overview
 of current and upcoming community projects.
