• Question P, a measure to implement a use tax to fund additional full time positions in the understaffed departments of Raymore Police, Raymore Public Works and Raymore Parks did not meet voter approval, with 2,562 no votes (54.51 percent) to 2,138 yes votes (45.49 percent) on Aug. 2, 2022.

Voter approval of Question P would have allowed the City of Raymore to create a minimum of four Police, two Public Works Maintenance and two Parks maintenance worker positions to get staffing levels closer to industry standards in order to continue to provide adequate public services at the level that residents have come to expect.

The impacts of the results of the measure to the City's fiscal year 2023 operating budget and measures that will need to be taken will be addressed by City Manager Jim Feuerborn at the Aug. 15 City Council work session.

"I would like to thank the voters who came out in response to Question P," Feuerborn said. "Although the measure did not pass, the support of the ballot question was promising. We will work toward the next steps moving forward, continue to educate and inform, and continue to provide the highest level of service possible for our citizens."
