Residents are invited to provide feedback at a public hearing in the Raymore City Hall Council Chambers on the proposed Capital Improvement Program (CIP) budget for the fiscal year 2023. The CIP proposes the development, modernization or replacement of physical public projects. The proposed capital budget includes project funding of \$9,509,319 for

26 recommended projects in Buildings & Grounds, Parks, Sanitary Sewer, Stormwater, Transportation and Water.
