- The Raymore City Council approved the first reading of the City's proposed fiscal year 2023 operating budget at the Oct. 11 City Council meeting, with the following amendments:
 - A one-time transfer of \$1 million from the General Fund to the Restricted Revenue Fund, allocating \$200,000 per year for the next five years to the Transportation Fund-with \$100,000 of that amount going to the City's annual Curb Improvement Program and \$100,00 to the City's annual Street Preservation Program each year.

- A \$200,000 transfer from the Capital Improvement Sales Tax Fund to the Transportation Fund for each of the next five years, with \$100,000 to the Street Preservation Program and \$100,000 to the Curb Improvement Program.
- A transfer of \$100,000 from the Excise Tax Fund to the Transportation Fund for each of the next five years, with \$50,000 to Street Preservation and \$50,000 to Curb Improvement.
- A transfer of \$150,000 from the Capital Improvement Sales Tax Fund to the Park Sales Tax Fund for each of the next five years for trail maintenance.
- A one-time transfer of \$30,000 from the General Fund to the Park Sales
 Tax Fund for Recreation Park trail repairs.
