


WEEKLY REPORT

- Development Services staff participated in a City Council work session pertaining to potential UDC Code provision changes that are anticipated as part of the passing of Missouri's Amendment No. 3 for recreational marijuana.

Parks & Recreation

- Park Superintendent Steve Rulo announced that the display fountain in Johnston Lake at Hawk Ridge Park has been removed for the winter season. It will be serviced and stored until being reinstalled early spring 2023.
- The Park Board met on Tuesday evening for the scheduled business meeting followed by a work session. Main topic was review of proposals for the playground improvements project at Recreation Park.
- Parks and Recreation Director Nathan Musteen met with City staff on the Sunset Lane / Hawk Ridge Park Plaza project and Johnston Dam inspection project.
- Centerview was the host site for Jane Redmond's Edward Jones Finance Company breakfast/lunch/dinner and pie give away.
- Athletic Coordinator Todd Brennon announced a new partnership with Jr NBA for our upcoming youth basketball program. This partnership includes NBA and WNBA branded materials including uniforms, coaching guidance, and related equipment. This is the second such partnership the department has which also includes NFL-Flag for the youth flag football program.

- All restrooms, water fountains, concession stands, and the sprayground have been fully winterized for the season. Year round restrooms are located in Hawk Ridge Park and at T.B. Hanna Station. Portable restrooms are located near the playgrounds in Memorial Park and Recreation Park.
- Park Superintendent Steve Rulo detailed a busy week for park crews preparing for the upcoming holiday season. Crews installed 25 t-posts for the Annual Raymore Christmas Tree Trail, contractors are working to finish installing the new Mayor's Christmas Tree, and park crews are finishing up building the ice rink which will open on Friday, Dec 2 during the Mayor's Tree Lighting event.
