- The General Municipal election for the City of Raymore for the offices of City Council will be held April 4, 2023. Filing for this election opens at 8 a.m. on Tuesday, Dec. 20, and continues through 5 p.m. on Jan. 17, 2023. A \$20 filing fee is required at the time the candidate declares candidacy. All four (4) wards will elect one candidate to serve a two (2) year term. Information is as follows:

- Park Superintendent Steve Rulo oversaw the installation of the new Mayor's Christmas Tree. Contracted crews installed the new 30' tree including lights and ornaments.
