Frigid temperatures next week: Dangerously cold temperatures arrive next week as an Arctic blast dips into the region. Make sure your outdoor water meter lid is securely closed (sometimes they can get knocked out of place by a mower, etc.) to keep your meter from freezing, take steps to keep your pipes from freezing by <u>viewing tips on our website</u>, and be sure to check on your neighbors and make sure pets and livestock are safe and protected from freezing temperatures.
