Upcoming

Trash service delays due to inclement weather:

Due to the winter storm's dangerous winds and wind chills and for the safety of Constable Sanitation's workers, Constable Sanitation will not provide trash service to Raymore customers on Thursday, Dec. 22.

- At this time, Constable plans to delay trash and recycling service for Thursday customers to Friday, Dec. 23.
- Friday customers (Silver Lake HOA): Constable Sanitation will delay service for your area to Saturday, Dec. 24 and will pick up TRASH ONLY. Thursday and Friday customers should check our website at www.raymore.com for updates,



as Constable will be constantly monitoring weather conditions and updating plans based on those forecasts. Yard waste will *not* be picked up the rest of this week. Thank you for your understanding.

Raymore Public Works crews are working around the clock to monitor road conditions and treat with salt as needed. At the extremely low temperatures we are experiencing, treatment products will not melt the snow/ice. Rain fell overnight just before temperatures dropped below freezing and flash-froze to the roadways, however the salt and snow adds traction to the streets. Please be extra diligent when traveling.
