Public Hearing: Risks of Landfill Development, 6 p.m., Thursday, Feb. 16, 2023, at Centerview, 227 Municipal Circle, Raymore.


The Raymore City Council will hold an urgent public hearing and vote on a bill regarding plans for a solid waste landfill in southeast Kansas City, Missouri, abutting neighborhoods, schools, small businesses, houses of worship and bodies of water in the surrounding communities.



The Raymore City Council will vote to approve or reject a one-half mile buffer, extending north from 155th Street on Raymore's north border, as allowed by the Revised Statutes of Missouri.

Administration

- The City of Raymore thanks the Grandview Board of Aldermen, Lee's Summit R-7 School District Board of Education and Cass County Commission for passing resolutions in opposition to a landfill near our homes, schools and businesses.
- Missouri State Rep. Mike Haffner introduced House Bill No. 909 (HB 909) to modify provisions governing solid waste disposal area permits. The bill is co-sponsored by Reps. Sherri Gallick, Michael Davis, Anthony Ealy and Kemp Strickler, and has support from several area representatives. HB 909 would require the approval of the governing body of an adjoining municipality if a landfill site is located within one mile of its city limits. The current language is a half-mile. HB 909 was read for the first time Jan. 23, 2023, and for the second time Jan. 24, 2023.
