RESOLUTION 22-36

"A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF RAYMORE, MISSOURI, EXPRESSING OPPOSITION TO ANY PROPOSED FUTURE SOLID WASTE OR DEMOLITION MATERIAL LANDFILL, OR ANY SOLID WASTE OR DEMOLITION MATERIAL TRANSFER STATION BEING LOCATED ON THE CITY'S SHARED NORTHERN BORDER WITH THE CITY OF KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI."

WHEREAS, the City of Raymore has information that a developer is considering applying to the City of Kansas City, Missouri to locate a landfill in the southeastern portion of that city on the northern shared border with the City of Raymore; and,

WHEREAS, the developer has confirmed their consideration of that site directly to the City of Raymore; and,

WHEREAS, the location of a landfill at the considered site would have long-term or permanent serious, destructive, and damaging impacts on surrounding areas; and,

WHEREAS, these impacts include environmental degradation, diminishment of property values, and a chilling effect on commercial and residential development among other negative and harmful effects; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Raymore strongly opposes the consideration of a landfill or transfer station in this location.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RAYMORE, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> This Resolution respectfully requests that the City Council of the City of Kansas City, Missouri join with the City of Raymore in opposition to any development application proposing a landfill or transfer station at this southeast Kansas City site and formally pass a Resolution stating that opposition.

<u>Section 2.</u> This Resolution respectfully requests that the City Council of the City of Kansas City, Missouri, within the Resolution of the City of Kansas City, Missouri, formally outline continued support for the Longview Lake Land Use Plan calling for the "highest and best use" of this area for low-density residential housing.

<u>Section 3.</u> This Resolution shall become effective on and after the date of passage and approval.

<u>Section 4.</u> Any Resolution or part thereof which conflicts with this Resolution shall be null and void.
