- On Monday, Feb. 27 in Jefferson City, the Missouri House of Representatives Rules-Administrative Oversight Committee voted DO PASS on House Bill 909. - The Jackson County Legislature passed a resolution in opposition to a landfill on the Jackson/Cass County border on Tuesday, Feb. 28. Thank you, Jackson County

• The KCMO City Council passed Resolution 230161 to direct the city manager to perform an evaluation of the city's solid waste needs and expressing opposition to any proposed future solid waste or demolition material landfill with a substitute to add a moratorium on permitting, plan review and zoning changes until the solid waste needs study is completed. The resolution was sponsored by Kansas City Mayor Quinton Lucas and Councilmembers Andrea Bough and Kevin McManus, with Councilmember Ryana Parks-Shaw joining as an additional cosponsor prior to the meeting. The resolution passed 11-2. The solid waste needs evaluation can take anywhere from six months to 18 months, which means the landfill developers will not be able to apply for any zoning changes or even for a permit with the MO Department of Natural Resources during that time to proceed with any landfill plans.
