Administration

- City of Raymore staff participated in the statewide tornado drill on Tuesday.
- Mayor Kris Turnbow and City Manager Jim Feuerborn, along with the City's lobbyists from John Bardgett & Associates, had a successful trip to the Missouri Capitol to visit with senators regarding the landfill and House Bill 909. While in Jefferson City, Mayor Turnbow submitted the <u>City's ordinance with the</u> <u>official vote and resident testimonies</u> to enact the <u>current</u> state statute allowing Raymore to oppose the development of a landfill within one-half mile of its





- border to an attorney for the Missouri Department of Natural Resources at the MDNR office.
- Landfill developers Jennifer and Aden Monheiser have—for the first time—contacted the Missouri Department of Natural Resources with a request for an "informational" meeting to discuss their plans for the landfill in southeast Kansas City. MDNR Permit Specialist Dave Drilling confirmed this information with a reporter from the Kansas City Star on March 7, 2023. (Click here for KC Star article.) The Monheisers have not filed any official permit applications and this is the *first* time they have reached out to MDNR, though they continue to claim they are in the "middle of the game." However, the Monheisers do have the ability to start the permitting process with MDNR, even with the current moratorium on zoning changes and landfills in Kansas City with the recent resolution from the Kansas City City Council. The Monheisers now have 19 lobbyists working for them.
