- 8th Annual Stream Cleanup, 8:30-11:30 a.m., Saturday, April 1 at Good Parkway Linear Park at Lucy Webb Road and Huntsman Boulevard (south of Lucy Webb). Bring your family and friends and a reusable water bottle and participate in this annual event to pick up trash in and along the stream and remove invasive Japanese/bush honeysuckle. Safety training, trash bags and loppers are provided at this event sponsored by the City of Raymore, South Grand River Watershed Alliance and the Missouri Stream Team. Learn more on our website.
- Raymore voters will see a proposed 3% city tax rate on the sale of recreational marijuana on the ballot on April 4, 2023. If approved by voters, the tax will NOT apply to medical marijuana sales, only to recreational marijuana sales. Tax dollars would go toward the City's General Fund, which pays for the core administrative and operational expenses of the City. Some of those expenses include personnel, all expenses of the Raymore Police Department, 911 dispatching

expenses, Animal Control and court operations, pothole patching, street lights and the electricity for them, snow removal/salt/brine, membership in the program that allows residents to safely dispose of household hazardous waste year-round at mobile collection events and permanent facilities, the annual community paper shredding event and landfill opposition expenses (legal and public relations).
