House Bill 909 was added to the Senate calendar and can be brought up any time on the floor for the vote from the full Missouri Senate. HB 909 has already gone through the full process in the Missouri House, so these are the final steps in the Senate before the bill is in front of the governor for his signature! We're appreciative of Majority Floor Leader Sen. Cindy O'Laughlin's leadership and look forward to her bringing this to the floor for debate as soon as possible. The bill is #15 under House Bills for Third Reading on the Senate calendar for Monday, April 24.
