Even though a few senators unfortunately prohibited House Bill 909 from getting the chance to have a vote, we know we had the support of the majority of the senators. There are no elections this year– these same elected officials will be in office if the bill to extend the landfill buffer is introduced again next year. • Kansas City, Missouri Mayor Quinton Lucas introduced <u>Ordinance 230418</u> banning landfills in Kansas City through June 1, 2024, at the May 11 City Council meeting. The measure is assigned to the Transportation, Infrastructure and Operations Committee and will be discussed further at an upcoming committee meeting- potentially May 17, but the agenda for that meeting is not posted as of Friday, May 12. The ordinance also calls for a regional discussion with stakeholders about the Kansas City region's long term waste strategy. <u>Click here to view the ordinance</u>.
