Though the Emancipation Proclamation freeing slaves was signed and made effective in 1863, it was not implemented in Texas until two years later on June 19, 1865, when 2,000 Union Troops arrived in Galveston Bay and announced that the more than 250,000 enslaved black people in the state were free by executive decree. That



- day became known as Juneteenth, now officially a federal holiday. City Hall will be open June 19 and trash service will run on a normal schedule this week.

Ordinance 230418: Declaring a citywide moratorium until June 1, 2024, on the approval of any permits, plan review, project plans, and zoning changes, where the subject matter of the project is a proposed demolition debris landfill, solid waste separation facility or transfer station, or sanitary landfill.
