- Raymore drivers should be aware of upcoming road work projects on Prairie Lane and at the intersection of Dean Avenue and North Cass Parkway starting Sept. 25, 2023:

Dean Avenue and North Cass Parkway: Sosaya Electrical Construction will begin work on the installation of a traffic signal at the Dean Avenue and North Cass Parkway intersection the week of Monday, Sept. 25. Signage will alert drivers to temporary lane closures while the work is taking place. Please be extra cautious in construction zones and slow down around workers and equipment.

Prairie Lane: The contractor will begin milling Prairie Lane between 58 Highway and 155th Street on Monday, Sept. 25. Signage and flaggers will alert drivers to temporary lane closures while the work is ongoing. Use extra caution and slow down in construction zones. The City of Raymore recently entered into a cost-share agreement with Cass County to complete the improvements to Prairie Lane to prepare for the months-long closure of Ward Road and the additional traffic that will inevitably be using Prairie Lane during Ward Road's complete reconstruction, which is scheduled for 2024. The Prairie Lane improvements include repair, construction and overlay.
