Raymore Arts Commission Work Plan
Fiscal Year 2024 (Nov. 1, 2023-Oct. 31, 2024)**

I. Purpose and Duties

The Raymore Arts Commission will:

- A. Engage citizens to cultivate art in the community;
- B. Promote close cooperation between the City and all private citizens, institutions, and agencies interested in or conducting activities related to the arts in the city, so that all arts resources within the community may be coordinated to maximize promotion and support of the arts;
- C. Facilitate communication between arts organizations; and
- D. Serve as an advisory board to the City Council in all arts-related matters including long range planning, allocations process and comprehensive strategic planning.

II. Membership

- A. The Arts Commission consists of seven members, appointed by the Mayor with the approval of City Council.

III. FY 2024 Goals & Tasks

The Arts Commission has selected to focus on the following goals and tasks:

- Incorporate more work sessions into the annual meeting calendar, including a Dec. 12 work session
- Increase the amount of public art in Raymore
 - Continue the rotating art program with replacement of Memorial Park sculpture in spring through the Creative Communities Alliance Sculpture on the Move! Program
 - Addition of a Greetings Tour mural to the heart of Raymore in cooperation with a local business
 - Continue to exhibit artists in the Raymore City Council Chambers and Cenerview gallery spaces
- Continue the annual Holiday Sing Along the first Monday in December in partnership with St. Paul's.
- Execute an Art Competition/Show in spring (Friday, April 19 is reserved for this event at Centerview).
- Have a variety of popular and quality giveaway items to build awareness and promote the commission and commission events/programs, such as stickers, coloring books and other swag.
- Set up a table with swag, coloring books and/or interactive activity on a spring Saturday morning at Recreation Park to engage the sports families and share program information.

- Host concerts at the Hawk Ridge Park Amphitheater every second Friday evening of the month from June through October. Include a food truck and additional activities at these events as resources allow.
- Discontinue Summer Scene in FY24 in order to focus on the second Friday concerts and put more resources into creating opportunities for creativity and engagement at these events.
- Staff is directed to create a hi-res image catalog of the temporary and public art commissioned by the Raymore Arts Commission.
- Continue to contemplate programs, long range goals and engagement strategies that align with the purpose of the Raymore Arts Commission.
